RE: Act 1349 of 1997-Municipal Judge Salary

Dear Judge Powell and Mayor McDaniel:

Enclosed herewith you will find a copy of Act 1349 of 1997 setting salaries for the Judges of the various Municipal Courts within the State of Arkansas. Act 1349 was approved by the Governor on 04-11-97 and does not contain an Emergency Clause; and therefore, Act 1349 will be effective on 08-01-97 or 90 days from the date of final adjournment of the 81st General Assembly on 05-02-97.

Your attention is directed to <u>Section 1. (zzz)</u> at page 18 of Act 1349, which provides for an annual salary for the Ozark Municipal Judge of not less than \$22,600.00 nor more than \$25,000.00. The minimum required annual Judge's salary appropriation by the County and City effective 08-01-97, would be \$11,300.00 each, plus matching benefits. The present 1997 Judge's salary appropriation for the County and City is \$10,100.00 each, plus matching benefits. An additional Judge's salary and matching benefits appropriation would need to be made by the Quorum Court and City Council during their June or July, 1997, meeting, in order to comply with Act 1349 by the effective date of 08-01-97.
