

**ORDINANCE NO. 1997-1**

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF OZARK, ARKANSAS:**

WHEREAS, duties of certain elected officials and employees' services are required in carrying on the business and services of the City of Ozark, Arkansas:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND EXECUTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OZARK, ARKANSAS;

It is hereby declared that an emergency exists and this salary schedule will be effective retroactive to December 1, 1996.

It is my understanding and that of the budget committee chairman that the salary ordinance for 1997 was to contain a five percent increase for all full-time employees, but no increase in starting salaries. The increase has been granted but through a lack of communication starting salaries were also increased five percent. A proposed revised salary ordinance is enclosed for your consideration.

When the present three persons still on the step system top out, it will no longer be necessary to list top pay for positions.

City inspector Ralph McKinney has informed me that he will accept the joint position of inspector/code enforcement officer on a trial basis. Since he did not officially accept both until January 7, 1997, I recommend and he concurs that his December salary and expense allowance be paid at the previous rate. With his permission, a December check was not given him until the council decides how it wants to handle the matter. As of this month he is filling out a time sheet and keeping account of his mileage.

A proposed job description for the city inspector/code enforcement officer follows:
